

Role Reports To: Youth Technical Director

Role Purpose: Lead the coaching and managing of players within a Foundation Phase team.

Main Responsibilities and Accountabilities

- Plan, delivery and evaluate all training sessions for your allocated age group
- Assist and deliver parents/player feedback/information evening and converse with parents where necessary.
- Work closing with other technical coaches within the Foundation Phase alongside RTC and Academy Operations Manager and Youth Technical Director on all matters.
- Plan, deliver and evaluate coaching sessions in line with the Club syllabus
- Manage and deliver individual player programmes and individual learning objectives for all age group players, working with the multi-disciplinary team and delivering to players and parents
- Assist the Technical Director in identification and recruitment of players in line with the recruitment model and succession planning.
- Complete all necessary paperwork as requested by the Youth Technical Director or RTC and Academy Operations Manager
- Liaison with the RTC and Operations Manager on all matchday logistics including facilities, officials, kit and equipment
- Support all matchday preparations including responsibility for team selection, team sheets, liaison with officials and relevant admin on full time or league platforms
- Attend all relevant Coach meetings (Phase / Whole Club) and contribute where required
- Responsibility for assigned Aston Villa kit and equipment
- Actively participate with any audit which the Club is required to undergo to maintain FA Licence
- To be prepared to do other duties to further the development of the Club and RTC as and when required
- Demonstrate commitment to Safeguarding by adhering to relevant policies, procedures and values relating to safeguarding children and adults at risk
- Support the Club's commitment to equality, diversity, and inclusion
